Notifications & Certifications

All notifications and certifications for family registry, civilian registration and inkan (stamp) registration can be done at city hall or any city administration center. Family registry notifications may be done after hours or on holidays at the city hall security desk on the first floor of the West building. Browsing of Musashino's address map or resident list, moving in notifications and foreigner registration may only be done at city hall.

Family Register Section (60-1839)

Moving

Musashino requires personal verification for any moves done. One must present a form of ID such as a driver's license, passport, resident card, special permanent resident certificate or any other picture ID issued by a government agency within period of validation. If you have your "my number" notification card, citizen registration card or national health insurance card, please bring them regardless of which paperwork you are filing.

Moving out of Musashino

Must submit notification at least 14 days prior to moving to the Family Register Section or any city administration center. Must be presented by person doing the move/head of the household.

Required items:

- 1. Resident card
- 2. My number notification card (if leaving country)
- 3. Citizen registration card or my number card
- 4. National health insurance card

Moving into Musashino

Must submit notification within 14 days of deciding/residing at new address to the Family Register Section (foreigners may only complete this at city hall). Must be presented by person doing the move/head of the household.

Required items:

- 1. Resident card
- 2. Passport if moving in from another country
- 3. Form with Japanese translation showing applicant is related to head of the household (required for households with foreigners and anyone moving in from overseas)
- 4. Previous address moving out notification (for domestic moves)
- 5. My number notification card
- 6. Citizen registration card or my number card

Moving within Musashino

Must submit notification within 14 days of deciding/residing at new address to the Family Register Section or any city administration center. Must be presented by person doing the move/head of the household.

Required items:

- 1. Resident card
- 2. Form with Japanese translation showing applicant is related to head of the household (required for households with foreigners and some doing an inner-city move)
- 3. My number notification card
- 4. Citizen registration card or my number card
- 5. National health insurance card

Naturalization

Tokyo Legal Affairs Bureau, Fuchu Office (042-335-4753)

All foreigners residing in Musashino that wish to be naturalized must go through the Tokyo Legal Affairs Bureau office in Fuchu. Please contact in advance as each application differs.

Family registrar application types

Foreigners must report all births and deaths to city hall. Paperwork is also required when a foreigner marries a Japanese national. Japan has a system to officially register personal information, but even if a foreigner marries a Japanese national, they are still only considered a spouse.

Residence certification & family registrar certificate issuance

In order to confirm one's identity a valid copy of the following forms of ID are required:

- 1. One of the following: Driver's license, passport, citizen registration card, my number card, resident card or special permanent resident certificate.
- 2. Two of the following: Insurance card, pension record book or a picture ID from a government organization.
- 3. One of the following plus an item from 2: Student card, employee card or another form of picture ID.

Family registrar

You must apply for a full or partial family registrar certificate at the municipality in which your original copy exists.

Those listed on the family registrar, close family or a proxy must have a personal ID (also a signed letter of proxy with signature and seal of the person they are proxying for) at the time of requesting. Close family may be asked to show their family registry at the time of request.

Any other third parties must present a personal ID, the reason for requesting and proof that the purpose is for objective use. All requests from a company require that company's seal and a company representative's seal.

Residence certification

Those listed on the family registrar, close family or a proxy must have a personal ID (also a signed letter of proxy with signature and seal of the person they are proxying for) at the time of requesting. Close family may be asked to show their family registry at the time of request.

Any other third parties must present a personal ID, the reason for requesting and proof that the purpose is for objective use. All requests from a company require that company's seal and a company representative's seal.

Residence certification issuance

Family Register Section (60-1839)

You may receive this certification at the current municipal office in the area in which you live.

Any Musashino citizens that apply elsewhere will need to check the time, location and fees for that municipality. You will be required to have things such as a driver's license, passport, citizen registration card, my number card, resident card, special permanent resident certificate or a picture ID issued from a government organization etc.

Any non-Musashino citizens can apply at Musashino city hall or any Musashino city administration center for \\$300 during hours of operation. You will be required to have things such as a driver's license, passport, citizen registration card, my number card, resident card, special permanent resident certificate or a picture ID issued from a government organization etc.

Inkan (stamp) registration

Family Register Section (60-1839)

You may register your inkan at city hall or any city administration center excluding night hours. Registration is \(\frac{\pmax}{300}\) and only the person the inkan belongs to may register. A signed and stamped letter of proxy will be accepted only in extenuating circumstances. Those who are under 15 or are in custody may not register on their behalf. You will be required to have things such as a driver's license, passport, citizen registration card, my number card, resident card, special permanent resident certificate or a picture ID issued from a government organization etc.

You may not register:

- 1. A machine-made stamp
- 2. An easily degradable stamp

- 3. Anything that will not fit into an 8mm or 25mm mold
- 4. Anything else specified by inkan related laws

Inkan registration certificate

In order to obtain this you must bring your inkan card (actual inkan not needed). Proxies may obtain the certificate so long as they provide an inkan card and the accurate name, address and date of birth of the registrant.

Loss of inkan registration certificate

You must complete a loss notification if lost. Proxies may apply on one's behalf with a letter of proxy.

Inkan breakage or deterioration

If the inkan breaks or deteriorates please submit a withdrawal notification. Proxies may apply on one's behalf with a letter of proxy.

Inkan card exchange

You may exchange you current card for a new one that can be used in vending machines. Only the owner of the card may set a PIN. After doing so proxies may not apply on your behalf as a PIN is required. With this you can use vending machines to issue an inkan registration certificates etc.

Citizen card

Family Register Section (60-1839)

The citizen card allows for any Musashino citizen to receive various certifications from vending machines. In order to do so a PIN is required and no proxy may register this PIN.

Certificate vending machines

There are 4 such machines in Musashino only usable for citizens with a citizen or inkan card who have registered a PIN. This card will become unusable if one moves out of Musashino.

Issuable certificates

Fees vary from ¥200-450 per service.

- 1. Residence certification (Can be obtained by anyone in the household).
- 2. Inkan registration certificate (Only owner may obtain).
- 3. Full or partial family registrar verification. (Anyone whose main registrar is in Musashino or anyone on their registrar may obtain).

Information listed regardless

Nationality, region, residency information (type, number and period of validity) and name in katakana.

Optional credentials

Family relation and place of original registration (Japanese nationals only)

Uncertifiable credentials

Name history, residence certification code, my number and other listed contents.

Temporary driving permission

Family Register Section (60-1839)

Excluding night hours, a temporary driver's license for any unregistered vehicles may be applied for at city hall or any city administration center. Permission costs ¥750 and must meet various criterion. Please contact us for more details. Duration is 3 days for an inspection and 5 days in other cases when additional registration etc. is needed.

Required items:

- 1. Inkan (companies must present the company seal and personal seal of representative)
- 2. Vehicle liability insurance certificate
- 3. Documentation to prove vehicle identification number (VIN) such as a car inspection certificate etc.
- 4. A personal ID is required for any non-company requests (valid driver's license etc.)

My number system

This system assigns each person registered as a resident in Japan with a 12 digit personal identification number. My number notification cards were sent out starting October 2016. January 2017 marked the start of the issuance of my number cards to anyone who applies. This number can be used for life as it is not effected by address changes etc. One must be extra careful when handling this card due to the risk of identity theft. Your "my number" is written on your "my number" card and notification card and can optionally be added to your residence certification.

When using your "my number," you will also be required to have a form of picture ID (driver's license etc.) to help prevent identity theft. If you present your "my number" card, this doubles as number and picture identification and no other forms of ID are required. If for some reason you are not in possession of your "my number" notification card (only usable for number verification) or other forms of ID, please let us know or check our website for more details. Below is paperwork that requires your "my number" as of January 1st, 2016. Musashino will only ask for this verification for paperwork that is mandated by law.

Your "my number" card can be used for its integrated chip (IC), a form of picture ID and for your "my number." The my number notification card can only be used for your "my number."

Lost card

If you happen to lose your "my number" card, please immediately report it to the police and copy down the submission number. Following that please also submit a notification to city hall or any city administration center. Additionally, you may call the My Number Call Center (0120-95-0178) in order to put a freeze on the card.

If you lose your notification card you may repeat the above process minus notifying the call center.

Social Insurance

National Health Insurance

National health insurance is where everyone contributes money on a monthly basis to help out those with medical costs in times of need.

Health insurance in Japan can be broken down into two categories; national health insurance provided by the locality the person resides and private health insurance.

Private health insurance

Can be broken down into the National Health Insurance Association, company specific health unions, sailor's insurance, daily laborer's insurance, welfare etc.

National health insurance

A mandatory catch all insurance policy all for people that are not enrolled in any of the above programs.

All foreigners residing in Japan for at least 3 months, except those who have received special exemptions, must enroll into national health insurance if not enrolled in company health insurance etc.

Enrollment

You must enroll when:

- ① You enter the country.
- 2 You exit a private form of insurance.
- 3 You stop receiving welfare benefits.

Please bring your resident card as well as your "my number card" in order to enroll. You will also need proof of leaving private insurance or welfare benefits ending for the above 2 and 3.

Unenrollment & status changes

Please notify us immediately if you are applicable for any of the following status changes.

- ① When moving out of Musashino or returning to live in home country.
- ② When enrolling in private health insurance.
- 3 When enrollee passes away.
- 4 When welfare benefit begins.
- (5) When the head of the house changes.
- 6 When households merge or separate.
- 7 When there is a change of address.

*Please be sure to file a status change report within 14 days of any of the above status changes. Please also be sure to bring your health insurance card at time of submitting a change request.

If you apply to number 2, please bring your health insurance card, resident card and my number card. If you apply to number 4, please bring your welfare acceptance certificate, resident card and my number card.

Calculation of social insurance taxes

National health insurance tax is calculated based on the number of enrollees, the previous year's income and the enrollees' ages. Please pay this via using the bill mailed out or with automated wire transfers. Please be sure to file your taxes each year as your health insurance premiums are based on the previous year's income.

Those who make under a certain income are eligible for social insurance tax reductions. These reductions are also based on filed income taxes. Please file for income taxes every year even if you have no income. You will not be eligible for any exemptions even if you have zero income if your tax return is not received.

Medical fees

Presenting your insurance card at any medical institutions will result in only having to pay a copayment. You may apply for a reimbursement in the following situations:

- ① Received medical care without presenting insurance card.
- 2 Paid for prosthetics, acupuncture, moxibustion, massages or transfer (Must be approved in advance by physician).
- 3 When medical care was received overseas (Must obtain a medical form for foreign doctors to fill out from city hall, a city administration center or our website. Form may be obtained after returning to Japan.).

Excessive medical fee reimbursement

If you pay over you monthly copayment limit (based on income) in the same month and same facility you are eligible for a reimbursement for anything over that limit. The reimbursement form will be mailed out after 3 months and be completed at city hall or any city administration center. Anyone under 70 only applies if the amount is all from the same medical institution. Anyone 70 or older may receive the reimbursement as long as the sum of all fees is over the monthly limit.

Lump-sum birthing allowance

Enrollees will receive ¥420,000 upon giving birth.

Funeral allowance

¥50,000 is payed out to the person who holds the funeral ceremony for funeral costs after an enrollee passes away.

Reissuance of insurance card

Insurance cards can be reissued upon loss or destruction of card through application at city hall or any city administration center. Please bring your "my number" card and residence card at the time of application. New cards will be mailed.

Insurance card usage restrictions

You may not use your insurance card for any of the following situations:

- ① Any wanton behavior resulting in illness or harm not limited to suicide or drug abuse.
- ② Musashino city has the right to bill the assailant party for damages for any insurance card usage due to excessive drunkenness, injury due to fighting, or traffic accidents due to a third party etc. Please submit a Third Party Illness or Injury form.

*Please be aware that out of court settlements where settlement money is received may be ineligible for insurance coverage.

National Retirement Pension

Including foreigners, anyone 20 or older and under 60 years of age and not enrolled in employment pension must enroll in national retirement pension. Please fill out proper paperwork at city hall or any city administration center.

Enrollment

You must enroll when:

- ① You enter the country.
- ② You exit a private form of pension such as when leaving a job

Please bring a document stating the day you entered Japan (passport etc.), a document showing proof of leaving company (if you leave) and your pension handbook if you currently have one.

Payment of retirement pension

After being enrolled in the insurance system for 10 years and reaching the age of 65, one will be eligible for retirement pension. Pension for disability and bereavement are also offered by meeting specific requirements.

Unenrollment lump sum payment

Any foreigners who are only staying in Japan on a short term basis may, if they have been enrolled into national retirement pension insurance for at least 6 months, may apply within 2 years of leaving Japan and receive a lump sum refund.

Corporate retirement pension

This pension is received by company employees and civil servants. All paperwork is filled out at place of work.

Latter Stage Elderly Medical Care System

The system is meant to aid with medical expenses. Those who are 75 or older are automatically enrolled in the system and those 65 or older with certain handicaps may arbitrarily enroll by showing proof of handicap.

Insured card issuance

The insured card is updated August 1st every other year. If there is a change of income, the card will be updated annually on August 1st and if there is a change in living conditions etc., the card will be updated on the first of the following month.

Moving

A copayment classification certificate is needed when moving outside of the greater Tokyo area, but not needed for any moves within.

Medical institution copayments

If you show your insurance card at any medical institution, you will be asked for either a 10% or 30% copayment.

- 1) The default copayment is 10%.
- ② Anyone who makes an annual income of ¥1,450,000 or more or any of their dependents must pay a 30% copayment.
- 3 Please inquire for further details as exclusions may apply.

Copayment reduction

Any households in which all members are non-taxable for municipal tax are eligible for a lower copayment for inpatient and outpatient medical costs (including hospital meals).

Specific illness treatment subsidy

Any of the following illnesses that require continued medical care are eligible for a medical fee reduction subsidy which sets the maximum monthly copayment to $\S10,000$. Application is required.

- ① Artificial dialysis needed due to a chronic kidney failure.
- ② Hemophilia
- 3 HIV resulting from taking blood related medicine.

Insurance premiums

Those who reach 75 will start paying the month of their birthday. Anyone who had an early enrollment will start paying the month of enrollment.

Yearly insurance premiums are the sum of per capita and per income amounts. Payments are taken directly from retirement pension (special) or done through a paper bill (normal).

Health promoting facilities subsidy

Anyone enrolled in latter stage elderly medical care insurance is eligible to use these facilities and receive a ¥3000 yen a night subsidy available for certain hotels/inns around the Kanto region, Nagano prefecture, and Nanto. (restrictions apply to number of days).

Medical fee reimbursement subsidy

You will be reimbursed for everything minus the copayment if you have paid the full amount of medical fees and submit your receipt and an application in any of the following situations:

- ① When you are overseas and have no choice but to receive medical care; or you plan to receive domestic or international medical care and are unable to submit your insurance card.
- ② When a doctor prescribed a massage, acupuncture or moxibustion therapy.
- 3 When a doctor prescribed a prosthetic such as a corset.

High cost medical care subsidy

To be eligible you must have payed in excess of your personal monthly copayment limit. The excess amount will be reimbursed. We will be totaling the amounts billing by medical institutions and sending a notice to those who are eligible (excluding costs that are ineligible for insurance payments).

Funeral cost subsidy

¥50,000 is payed out to the person who holds the funeral ceremony for funeral costs after an enrollee passes away.

^{*}Please contact us if you wish to apply for any of the above subsidies as each one requires different documents etc.

Municipal Tax

Municipal tax

Anyone who possesses any address within city limits as of January 1st each year is subject to municipal tax. The tax is based on per capita and per income.

Fixed asset tax

Anyone who owns property, a building/s or depreciable assets as of January 1st of each year. One will be taxed fully even assuming the property was demolished or sold off during the year. Anyone holding a depreciable asset for income or business purposes must submit a tax filing by the end of January each year.

How to pay municipal tax

Financial institutions and post office (Yucho Bank)

You may settle account at the financial institution located within city hall or any city administration center (Mon-Fri, 8:30-5:00). Paying at any non-city certified financial institutions may result in a transaction fee.

Wire transfers

The tax will be withdrawn automatically from your specified bank account on the payment date of the tax. You may apply via mail, a financial institution or directly at the Tax Payment Section of city hall.

Convenience stores

You may pay any bills \\$300,000 or less at a convenience store.

Credit cards

You may apply on Yahoo's payment site (koukin.yahoo.co.jp). You must burden any fees when paying bills over \\$10,000. You may only pay bills of \\$1,000,000 or under via credit card and must fill out a form for each bill paid using this method.

Public Safety & Crime Prevention

Public safety

Public Safety and Crisis Management Section (60-1916)

Musashino prioritizes its citizens' safety over all else. In 2002, Musashino enacted ordinances in order to protect public safety and is working with the public, corporations and related administrative institutions in order to ensure solid results.

Safety patrols

Public Safety and Crisis Management Section (60-1916)

White Eagle

Every day 3 cars patrol around the entire city and visit schools, daycares, and community centers to ensure safety.

Blue Caps

The blue caps all wear blue hats and patrol around the Kichijoji station area in order to prevent unwanted solicitation and other behavior.

Midnight patrol

This patrol takes place around the Kichijoji station area with a focus on middle schoolers returning home from cram class and residential districts with low foot traffic.

Citizen safety patrols

Paid volunteers work in conjunction with Musashino to ensure the safety of kids going to and from school, at school events etc. These people can be identified by their jumper, hat and armband and patrol the city on foot and on bike.

Musashino Crime Prevention Society

This society works year-round to prevent theft, break-ins etc. and has various community patrols.

Safety patrol volunteering

Please contact us if you wish to take part in safety patrols or create one of your own.

When to dial 110 (emergency hotline)

Please dial 110 in the following situations:

- If you are the victim of theft
- If you are the victim or witness of violence
- If you hear a scream, explosion, gunshot etc.
- If you shelter someone who is lost or has run away from home
- If you see someone or something suspicious

In such situations please try your best to remain calm and relay the following information as accurately as nossible:

- What happened / what you witnessed
- The time / location / landmarks
- Your name, address and phone number

How to protect yourself from crime

Crime prevention devices

Musashino Police Station (55-0110)

Please make use of anti-snatch nets for bike baskets etc. They also help prevent things from falling out while riding.

Break-in prevention

Break-ins have been happening in the Musashino area. Over half of break-ins occur due to carelessness. Make sure you always lock your door even if only going out for a few minutes. Also try to refrain from getting a glass door that can easily be broken and opened or never leave the house with only that door closed.

Wire transfer fraud

If you get a phone call or request etc. from someone claiming to be family or a city official demanding that you make a wired transfer, do not be hasty. Instead, make sure you carefully think over the situation. Musashino will never demand any payments. Even if taxes etc. are not paid, the city uses other methods for collection (see tax section).

This hotline is to give advice and counseling to those that have fallen victim to a crime.

Non-disaster related medical & fire emergencies

When there has not been a major disaster, one can dial the <u>119</u> number at any time to report a medical emergency or other emergencies such as a fire. All theft related inquires etc. should be directed to the police by dialing 110. When you call be sure to <u>clearly</u> state the emergency and address. Fire is (kaji) and emergency rescue is (kyukyu (QQ)). The authorities will then use the address and or GPS tracking to arrive at your location as soon as possible.

Disaster Preparedness

Japan is home to many natural disasters. These include, but are not limited to earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tornados, tidal waves, hurricanes landslides and lightning strikes. The most frequent disasters are earthquakes.

Even if there is minimal damage, a large earthquake causes mass panic, transportation networks come to a complete halt and food and consumables are very difficult to obtain. In order to be prepared in the case of a disaster, it is recommended that you have the following items ready:

- 1 A radio
- 2 Batteries
- 3 Bottled water for drinking etc.
- 4 Non-perishable food (cans (can opener), instant noodles, crackers, dry food, rice etc.)
- ⑤ Lighting (a flashlight, candles a lighter etc.)
- 6 Utility items (a knife, gloves, plastic bags, toilet paper, contact solution, a sanitary towel, toilet bags if toilet unusable etc.)
- 7 A first aid kit & necessary medications
- 8 Money (cash, a credit/debit card, inkan, form of ID)
- Protection (a helmet, a place to take cover from falling objects)
- ① Clothing (extra for winter)
- ① Extra baby supplies
- ① A route to the nearest evacuation facility
- (3) An alternate way to get home. Since most if not all public transportation comes to a stop, walking or riding a bike home may be the only option. Sometimes the roads are clear because people are not driving and taking a taxi or available buses could be very fast.
- ① Disposable bags, coagulant and deodorizer etc. in case toilet in unusable after a disaster. Also enough keitai toilets.

Official declaration of disaster

The Tokai region has an earthquake advisory system. The system is setup to give as much advance warning as possible, although this is rarely doable if the earthquake is in close proximity. There will be a siren that goes off alerting people as well as news on the radio, tv and internet. Be sure to prepare in any way after hearing it and to follow any instructions given. Also be dually aware of subsequent disasters such as tidal waves, landslides and especially fires and falling debris. Also be sure to tune in to local radio and check with local authorities for the most accurate information.

Steps to take during and after a disaster

1 During Occurrence

- If an earthquake occurs, try your best to remain calm and prioritize keeping yourself safe.
- Get under a secure desk etc. or near a support pillar in a strong building is a good idea. Shelter body from falling objects and do not get near any glass. Do not approach any block walls that could crumble.

2 1-2 minutes after

• Turn off all sources of heat, especially any gas stoves. If possible, shut off the gas at the main valve. • Open to door to ensure there is an escape route and confirm the safety of all family members.

3 3 minutes after

- Wear proper footwear to protect from broken glass.
- Have emergency goods prepared in a backpack ahead of time.
- Beware of consequent disasters such as tidal waves, landslides, volcanic eruptions etc. and especially aftershocks.

4 5 minutes after

- Make sure that all elderly people around you and those who cannot help themselves are safe.
- · Call out if any fires break out in a loud voice and work together to put them out.
- Be sure to tune into Musashino FM (78.2MHz) to get accurate and current information.

(5) 5-10 minutes

- Try not to use any phone calls.
- Make sure you evacuate your home if there is any danger of collapsing.
- Wear a helmet and go to your nearest shelter.
- Steer clear of any walls or glass
- Refrain from using any vehicles as emergency vehicles need to use the roads. If you are in a car be sure to pull it over to a safe location, get out, leave doors unlocked and key in ignition and go on foot. This is in case emergency crews need to move your vehicle.
- Also wear a backpack filled with emergency goods and keep both hands free at all times.
- Setup bag etc. for toilet if needed (if sewage systems come to a halt).

6 10 minutes - a couple of hours

- · Pick up children from school etc. and leave a message on your door where you are headed.
- Assist in putting out fires and rescue operations and report all matters to the proper authority.
- Be sure to shut off electrical breaker.

7 Up to 3 days after

- Do not rely on emergency rations until at least 3 days, if not a week after the disaster.
- Stay up to date on all news from your municipality.
- If your home is livable then please continue to stay there. However, if it has been destroyed or there is a risk of collapse, please stay at the nearest shelter.

Daily preparation

- ① Inspect or have your house inspected for cracks, furniture that could fall etc. and try to create as safe of a situation as possible.
- 2 Make sure yourself and everyone in your family know what to do in the case of an emergency (prepare contact information and location of refuge etc.).
- 3 Decide roles for an emergency as much as possible with neighbors.
- 4 Prepare ways of extinguishing fire and check them periodically for functionality.
- (5) Have at least 3 days of food and water available and an emergency use backpack.
- **6** Take part in disaster and evacuation drills as much as possible.

People have also found using SNSs useful in relaying information during a disaster.

Transportation

Using bicycle parking lots

Any commuters or shoppers etc. should only use paid parking lots. Commuters must register for monthly use and all others must also use paid lots (some lots offer free parking for under 2 hours for non-commuters). Fees vary per lot. Please contact specific lot for details.

Impounded bikes

If you park your bicycle or motor scooter in a non-parking area it will be impounded on sight, no questions asked. Even if you leave your bike outside of these zones, you will be fined if it is deemed to be a nuisance. Please utilize parking lots as listed on the map below. To retrieve an impounded bike, please take your ID, bike key and fine to the bike impound. Bikes will be disposed of if they are not retrieved within 30 days of impound based on municipal ordinances.

Fines: bicycle: ¥3000, motor scooter: ¥5000

Bike safety

In order to promote safe commuting and transportation the Musashino city administration joined forces with the Musashino Police in October, 2008 and hold safety classes. Please check Shiho Musashino, come directly to the Traffic Management Section or check out Musashino's official website. Must commute in Musashino and be middle school aged or higher. Courses are free.

Upon completing the course, one will earn a completion certificate which will gain them several privileges. Will receive priority when waiting in line to register at new parking lots. Will receive ¥1000 worth of TS Mark insurance (liability and injury insurance) limited to one incident for Musashino citizens.

Mu Bus

This is an affordable bus service for anyone that gives access to smaller streets that normal city buses cannot travel. The bus travels 9 routes throughout Musashino. The bus is ¥100 per person and any children under elementary school age ride free. Accepts Suica and Pasmo IC cards. Tickets are available in a booklet of 11 tickets for sale inside the bus for ¥1000.

Traffic accidents

In the event of a traffic accident, you must take all necessary steps to ensure the safety of everyone involved. In extreme cases please call an ambulance (119). To prevent further accidents please immediately call the police (110) to guide traffic. If the police are not notified it will be near impossible to claim any damages without a certificate of traffic accident.

There has been an increase in accidents involving senior citizens. Do not cross the street where there are no crosswalks and wait for a green signal to cross. Also be sure to wear bright or reflective clothing at night to increase visibility to motorists.

Mutual aid insurance

Mutual aid insurance is run by the Tokyo metropolitan government and covers consolation money awarded in the case of an accident. You may apply at the Traffic Management Section, any city administration center or select financial institutions. Plan A is ¥1000 a year and covers you for ¥40,000-3,000,000. Plan B is ¥500 a year and covers you for ¥20,000-1,500,000.

Birthing & Child Raising Aid

Birth fee subsidy

National Health Insurance Section (60-1834)

Anyone enrolled in national health insurance through Musashino is entitled to a one time subsidy of ¥420,000 per newborn child. Anyone enrolled in other healthcare should consult their provider to receive the subsidy.

Hospital fee subsidy

Social Welfare Section

Support provided for low income earners. Please contact in advance for details.

Health exam subsidy

Health Center (51-0700)

A partial subsidy for medical exam fees for infants and nursing or expectant mothers in a low income household.

Premature birth subsidy

Health Center (51-0700)

Any premature children under 2kg or otherwise unable to perform necessary life functions. If doctor deems that support is needed it will be issued until 2 days before the child's first birthday.

Qualifying conditions:

Convulsions, movement irregularities, body temperature below 34 degrees Celsius, strong cyanosis, respiratory/circulation/digestive problems or jaundice.

Air pollution subsidy

Health Center (51-0700)

Any child that meets any of the following conditions is eligible for this subsidy.

Bronchial asthma, chronic bronchitis, asthma induced bronchitis, pulmonary emphysema or a repeat occurrence of any of these conditions. Must be under 18 years of age, been living in Tokyo at least a year (6 months for those under 3), enrolled in health insurance and not start smoking after application.

Infant Checkups & Vaccinations

Each person will be notified of checkup and vaccinations on an individual basis.

Hello Baby Visit

Health Center (51-0700)

A public health nurse and midwife will visit any household with a child up to 4 months old to give advice. Please submit birth notification form to the Health Center as soon as possible so we can carry out the visit.

Child raising

Health Center (51-0700)

Counseling in regards to birthing or raising a child. Available 9:00-5:00pm in person or a staff visit on a reservation basis or by phone.

Child growth

Community Rehabilitation Consulting Habit (55-8510)

Consultation for anyone concerned about child's physical and intellectual development.

Infant teething

Health Center (51-0700)

Class on how to prevent cavities for one to two and a half year olds. Also guidance on how to take care of teeth for children up to the age of four.

Musashino Health Center

Health Center (51-0700)

The Health Center offers various types of counseling from pre-birth to infant-raising. Available on an in person and home visit basis by reservation.

Pregnancy counseling

Offer counseling to birthing mothers and family by a public health nurse who will also issue the Mother Child Handbook.

Hello Baby Visit

This visit is done for baby within 4 months of birth. The baby's weight is taken, counseling is given on child-raising and a ticket is given for free Musashino grown vegetables. Please submit a birth notification form immediately after birth.

Baby food

Courses given on baby food and teething on a reservation basis.

Child-raising counseling

Public health nurses, dieticians and midwives give advice about once a month on child-raising at the Health Center, Civic Hall or Public Hall. Body measurement also taken. Additionally, counseling is available over the phone anytime and in person or on a staff visit basis by reservation.

Infant growth counseling

Once a month on a reservation basis, counseling is given on problems concerning infants such as: slow body growth, lack of vocalization, lack of movement and how to interact with children etc.

Infant teething counseling

Tooth exams and counseling are given on a periodic basis to children 18 months to two and a half years of age on a reservation basis.

Senior citizen immunizations

Health Center (51-0700)

Influenza immunizations

Available with a partial subsidy for:

- 1. Anyone 65 or older on day of vaccination.
- 2. Anyone 60-64 with heart, kidney or lung disorders that have a significant impact on daily living or anyone infected with an immunodeficiency virus (AIDS etc.) that makes daily living nearly impossible.

Pneumonia immunizations

Available for those who have yet to receive vaccination and meet the following conditions:

- 1. Must turn 65 in the year that the day of vaccination is in.
- 2. Anyone 60-64 with heart, kidney or lung disorders that have a significant impact on daily living or anyone infected with an immunodeficiency virus (AIDS etc.) that makes daily living nearly impossible.
- 3. Those subject to the measure that elapses in 2018. Please contact for details.

Social Welfare

Birthing mother allowance

Social Welfare Section (60-1849)

Musashino offers an allowance to mothers giving birth who are part of a low income household. Must consult prior to giving birth.

Support for low income households

Social Welfare Section (60-1254)

Consultation

Consultation support is offered to anyone who is experiencing difficulties with family, loss of work, mental or physical impairments, debt etc. The support counselors give custom tailored support to each person based on their individual needs so they will become able to independently solve their problems.

Home Search Allowance

Those under 65 years of age, have been out of work for less than two years and are having difficulty making rent payments or are in fear of losing their home may be eligible for a rent/payment allowance for up to 3 months. Must meet certain conditions based on household revenue, total assets and Hello Work (Japan's unemployment agency) job searching status.

Job Search & Reinstatement Support

This service is for those who have been out of work for an extended period of time. The support is offered for one year and helps those who have been out of the loop to gain the necessary skills to get back on their feet and get back into the workplace. This includes training seminars, on the job training and job searching support. Restrictions based on household revenue and total assets.

Learning Support

Learning support is available for low income households. Support targets 3-6th grade elementary school students and 1-3rd grade middle school students. The learning support is for Japanese, English and math subjects only. Restrictions based on household revenue and total assets.

Welfare

Social Welfare Section (60-1254)

This is based on Article 25 of the Japanese Constitution and stipulates that anyone under a certain standard of living is eligible to receive welfare. Please contact the Social Welfare Section for more details as to what this covers and whether or not you are eligible.

Handicap Services

System overview

On April 1st of 2006, the Services and Support for Persons with Disabilities Act was passed. Up until that point many individual laws governed the rights and services rendered. Additionally, children with handicaps have been fully covered by the Child Welfare Act as of April, 2012.

On April 1st, 2013, the Services and Support for Persons with Disabilities Act's name changed and was made to support daily living for eligible parties. Those with incurable illnesses also became covered by this law. Furthermore, those enrolled in LTC insurance will be favored by that system and receive those benefits over those stipulated in this act.

How to receive benefits:

- 1. Anyone who wishes to receive benefits must come in person to apply and will be subject to screening for approval.
- 2. Each municipality requires the submittal of a service usage plan submitted by a third party support organization.
- 3. The benefit amount and/or whether or not there is eligibility is then decided based on submitted forms.
- 4. The third party support organizations then meet and discuss the benefit amount and readjust the plan to fit the budget.
- 5. The service agreement then begins.

Services rendered

Physical handicap handbook (Shintaishogaisha techo)

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

This is for those who either through sickness or an accident have a physical handicap. The handicap is rated level 1-6 depending on severity. Up to ¥5000 subsidized for attainment of medical diagnostic certificate.

Intellectual handicap handbook (Ai no techo)

Under 18 years old Tokyo-to, Suginami-ku Children's Counseling Office (03-5370-6001)

Over 18 years old Tokyo-to, Handicap Welfare Center (03-3235-2963)

This if for anyone with an intellectual handicap which is rated level 1-4. Must call to make an appointment to fill out paperwork.

Mental handicap handbook (Seishinshogaisha hoken fukushi techo)

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

Given to those that have a condition that interferes with daily living over a long period of time and rated level 1-3. Up to ¥5000 subsidized for attainment of medical certificate.

Acquiring benefits

Physical or intellectual handicap welfare allowance

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

This is for anyone with a physical or intellectual handicap level 1-4, progressive muscular atrophy or cerebral palsy. Only for those under 65 and with a handicap handbook and who have applied. Benefit based on age and pay grade and is \\$11,000 or \\$15,500 a month (half for those over income restrictions).

Special handicap allowance / Child handicap welfare allowance

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

Both allowances for any children with a high level of handicap (restrictions based on income). The special handicap allowance is for those 20 years of age or over and is \$26,810 a month. The child handicap welfare allowance is for anyone under 20 and is \$14,580 a month.

High degree physical or intellectual handicap allowance

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

For those with a high level of handicap (anyone 65 or older may not apply, income restrictions apply). ¥60,000 a month.

Special child raising allowance (tokubetsu jido fuyo teate)

Children and Family Support Center (60-1852)

For anyone raising a child with a heavy or moderate handicap and under 20 years of age (income restrictions apply). Level 1 is \(\frac{4}{51}\),100 a month and is for anyone with a level 1-2 physical or intellectual handicap handbook. Level 2 is \(\frac{4}{34}\),030 a month and is for anyone with a physical handicap level 3-4 (only part of 4), an intellectual handicap level 3 or an internal, mental or growth handicap deemed to be equivalent to the above statuses.

Child raising allowance (Jido ikusei teate)

Children and Family Support Center (60-1852)

For anyone raising a child under 20 years of age that has a physical handicap level 1-2, an intellectual handicap level 1-3 or progressive muscular atrophy or cerebral palsy. ¥15,500 a month.

supersedes this benefit. Covered prosthetics include: glasses, artificial eyes/limbs, white canes, hearing aids, walkers, wheelchairs etc.

Daily living tools

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

This is to distribute tools needed for daily living based on level of handbook. This is for anyone living in their own home with a handicap or incurable illness (not all illnesses apply). Subsidy differs per equipment needed (income restrictions apply). Covered tools include: electric cookers, blind watches, signaling devices, text-to-speech devices, artificial larynxes, special beds, bathing assist devices etc.

Household equipment improvement

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

Home equipment improvement available for those with certain handicaps or incurable illnesses. Prior consultation required (subject to age and income restrictions). Small to medium improvements and mobility upgrades are eligible.

Housing/rent subsidy

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

Partial subsidy for non-municipal housing. For those who have lived in Musashino for at least 3 years from the closest April 1st and have a physical handicap handbook level 1-4 or an intellectual handicap handbook level 1-3 (income restrictions apply).

Physical & intellectual handicap medical fee subsidy

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

Covers part or all of copayment. Must be under 65 years of age and have a physical handicap handbook level 1-2, (level 1-3 for internal handicaps) or an intellectual handicap handbook level 1-2 (income restrictions apply).

Medical & rehabilitation subsidy for becoming independent

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

A system to provide anyone over 18 with handicaps a way to receive the proper medical care to become independent and is for any therapy or treatment that has a guaranteed chance of improving or correcting their condition (subsidy subject to income restrictions and copayments).

Child-raising medical support for becoming independent

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

A subsidy which allows for children with a physical handicap to receive early stage medical care and gain vital life skills. Must be under 18 years old and require a surgery with proven results to improve quality of life.

Independence support treatment subsidy

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

For anyone with a mental illness and commuting to a care facility. The medical insurance cost will be partly of fully subsidized (income restrictions apply).

Children mental handicap hospitalization fee subsidy

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

For anyone under 18 years old that needs hospitalized care due to a mental illness.

Children chronic illness medical fee subsidy

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

Any child under 18 years old that needs long term medical treatment due to a chronic illness (only certain illnesses apply).

Medical report subsidy

Social Welfare Section for the Disabled (60-1847)

For anyone with a physical or intellectual handicap handbook or receiving independence training for a mental illness. The subsidy covers up to ¥5000 worth of diagnostic report fees for those with a handbook and up to ¥3000 for those with a mental illness.

Handicap related services

Training (55-3612)

Offer training to improve bodily function for those middle-aged to about 65 years of age and provided by physical, occupational and speech therapists.

Short term stay (city run)

A place to that will temporarily care for loved ones who live in Musashino and are under the age of 65 with a physical or intellectual handicap. You must register in advance to use this service. This service can be used to get some relief from care giving or when you are unable to provide proper care at home.

Bathing and bed cleaning services

Beauty services

Civil Welfare Society (23-0701)

Anyone with a leg or abdominal handicap level 1-2, a visual handicap level 1 or an intellectual handicap handbook level 1-2 is eligible for tickets (limited value) up to 5 times a year for hair or beauty treatment.

Meal services

Anyone under 65 and single or in a handicap only household with a level 1-2 visual handicap, level 2 hearing handicap, a level 1-3 physical handicap or a level 1-3 internal handicap is eligible to receive lunch service for ¥500.

Long Term Care Insurance System

Once an applicant applies at city hall it is determined whether or not they need LTC. Service can only be used if deemed necessary which is a process done through the insurer (Musashino). If needed, the applicant then contracts directly with LTC service providers and usually pays them a copayment (please inquire for percentage). If applied for a representative from the LTC Support Center or city hall will make a visit to inspect the circumstances. The services are usually funded 50% by premiums and 50% by government subsidy. Anyone 40 years of age or older is required to pay into this system.

Eligibility

Senior Citizens Support Section (60-1845)

Insured type 1: Anyone 65 years of age or older and is deemed to need or will need LTC.

Insured type 2: Anyone 40-64 years of age that has certain health conditions. Please inquire to learn which health conditions apply.

Insurance premium calculation methods

Those 65 and older (insured type 1): Insurance premiums are decided every 3 years in the city's long term care plan. **Those 40-under 65 (insured type 2):** Premium amount is dependent upon the insurance type that you are enrolled in. Those enrolled in national health insurance may contact the Insurance Section. For all other inquiries please contact the private provider directly.

Payment method

Those 65 and older (insured type 1): In accordance with the LTC Act, Article 131, anyone that receives a retirement pension of ¥180,000 or more per year will have premiums automatically deducted from their pension payments. The automatic deduction takes priority so no other payment methods are available. All others will receive a bill for each premium payable manually or through a wire transfer.

Those 40-under 65 (insured type 2): LTC payments are made on top of any regular health insurance premiums. Social insurance premiums are required to be paid in half by employer in principal. The premium calculations vary depending on the provider. National health insurance is calculated based on income, paid by the head of the household and varies per municipality.

LTC Comprehensive Community Support Center (city office) (60-1947)

LTC preventative care, general counseling support, rights protection, abuse prevention services, care manager support etc. are provided by this center. Each home LTC support center also has reception for the Regional Comprehensive Support Center's counseling services.

Home LTC & regional comprehensive support centers (below 6 locations)

Senior Citizens Support Section (60-1846)

There are 6 centers in total that handle various types of counseling via the phone, in person or on a visitation basis. They also cooperate with the Regional Comprehensive Support Center in order to provide support and counseling for long term care preventative services.

Home LTC & regional comprehensive support centers provide information on various LTC services and also counseling and support to find the best match of services for everyone based on their individual needs.

General child raising counseling & abuse reporting

We give counseling on every type of household related issue and also strive to stop abuse at an early stage or prevent it entirely. Aside from national holidays and the end of the year, we have a non-appointment counseling system.

Pre/post birth helpers

We dispatch helpers to assist with child raising and chores due to illness etc. for mothers who are finding it difficult to do it on their own.

Usage limitations

Mothers with a normal birth may use the service for up to 90 days after birth and having received their Mother & Child Health Handbook for a total of 80 hours (mothers with multiple conceptions up to 1 year and 120 hours).

Temporary overnight childcare

Children & Family Support Center (60-1850)

We provide short term overnight stays if for some reason due to fatigue, elderly care etc. one is unable to attend to their child. Must live in Musashino and child must be over 2 and not yet have graduated elementary school. May use up to 7 nights. Stay includes meals, bathing, sleep etc. Fee based usage, but reductions available

Single parent & women's counseling

Children & Family Support Center (60-1850)

Single parent household & women's counseling

Counseling support for single parent families and women related to living and work etc.

Single parent household support

Household helpers for single parent households needing daily support due to work etc. Copayment may be required based on income bracket.

Single parent/women's welfare loans

Loan to help support a child's education for single parents and widows.

Pursuit of Knowledge Subsidy

Subsidy to help people become independent and gain trade specific skills to help them excel.

Special child raising allowance

Children and Family Support Center (60-1963)

Special child raising allowance (tokubetsu jido fuyo teate) is for anyone raising a child with a heavy or moderate handicap and under 20 years of age (income restrictions apply). Level 1 allowance is ¥51,450 a month and is for anyone with a level 1-2 physical or intellectual handicap handbook. Level 2 is ¥34,270 a month and is for anyone with a physical handicap level 3-4 (only part of level 4), an intellectual handicap level 3 or an internal, mental or growth handicap deemed to be equivalent to the above statuses.

Child raising allowance

Children and Family Support Center (60-1963)

Child raising allowance (jido ikusei teate) is for anyone raising a child under 20 years of age that has a physical handicap level 1-2, intellectual handicap level 1-3 or has progressive muscular atrophy or cerebral palsy. ¥15,500 a month. Income restrictions apply.

Ninka certified daycares

Child Raising Support Section (60-1854)

If a child's guardian is working, falls sick, gives birth, is giving care to the elderly etc. they are eligible to utilize a daycare center, however, the parents will be rated based on their conditions such as working hours etc. to determine eligibility.

Pediatric certified nurses

Child Raising Support Section (60-1854)

Certified pediatric nurses can make house visits or nurse children in a small scale daycare facility for infants up to 2 years of age. For more information please contact us.

If the contents haven't been depleted put in separate bag and write nokoriari.

Batteries





All regular batteries and rechargables with the recycle mark can be submitted at retail outlets. Any electronics or toys in which the battery cannot be removed are hazardous trash.



Lighters

Only put out empty ones. If there is lighter fluid inside write nokoriari on the bag.





Fishing goods Needle holders and weights etc.

Mercury blood pressure devices Mercury thermometers



Hazardous trash bags are available at the Refuse Management Section and all city administration and community centers.

Bottles — (Once a week)



General glass bottles from food and drink products excluding white bottles.

Place in a transparent/semi-transparent bag after lightly rinsing and don't mix with cans.

- ■Put out broken glass on the same day, but be extra careful and be sure it is safe for those collecting it as well.
- ●Corks and lids must be put in burnable, non-burnable or other plastics based on material.
- It's fine even if you cannot remove labels.
- If it cannot be cleaned it is non-burnable trash.



- Heat resistant and white glass bottles are non-burnable trash.
- Any bottles used to store food or make cider etc. are non-burnable trash.
- •Will be recycled into glass and subbase etc.

Please have trash and recyclables out by 9:00am.

Cans — Once a week

Place in a transparent/semi-transparent bag after lightly rinsing and don't mix with bottles.

- Bend metal lids inward or insert into cans.
- Any parts that are not solid metal must be put in non-burnable trash.
- Anything that cannot be cleaned is non-burnable trash.
- Cans full of dirty paper and cigarette butts etc. cannot be recycled so please put out with non-burnable trash.
- ●Will be recycled into cans, aluminum and iron products.

Steel and aluminum cans from canned goods, juice etc.

Paper products — Once a week

Please try not to put out on a rainy day as wet paper products will grow mold.

Please separate by type and tie up or place in a bag. Please do not use tape.

Newspapers and flyers



Are you mixing miscellaneous paper with burnable trash?

Any envelopes, memos, candy boxes, makeup boxes, cardboard and packaging are all recycled into cardboard or magazines etc. Please place into a clear bag, label it zatsugami and tie it tightly.


Make sure all paper clips and other metal/non-paper products have been removed.



Please remove plastic from tissue boxes and envelopes etc. and put the plastic in burnable trash.

Recyclable (Misc. papers)

- Cardboard, candy/makeup boxes
- Copy paper, paper packaging, paper bags, envelopes
- Post cards, letter paper, shredded paper
- Chopstick wrappers, sticky notes
- Chopstick wrappers, sticky notes
- Calendars, tissue boxes
- Cigarette boxes
- · Wrap and paper foil, toilet paper cardboard
- Pulp molds (egg and fruit containers)



X Non-recyclable (non burnable trash) −

- Dirty/carbon/oil/blotting paper
- Glossy receipts or faxes
- · Adhesive paper, tape, Japanese paper, pictures
- Seal or wax paper
- Plastic paper (part of wrappers etc.)
- Ironing paper
- Aluminum lined paper
- Water proof lining paper (food and drink paper etc.)
- Fragrant paper (detergent, soap, incense etc.)









Most recyclables will have this mark, but sometimes non-recyclables have it as well. Please refer to above information to determine whether or not it is recyclable.

All cartons, even with some aluminum are ok.





Clothing — Once a week

Please put out in a transparent/semi-transparent bag.

* If clothes get wet they may grow moldy and will later be put into burnable trash. Please refrain from putting out on a rainy day.



Wearable clothes

- ●Any dirty clothes or underwear, socks, scarves, ties, gloves and Japanese traditional wear etc. should be put into burnable garbage.
- All towels and sheets etc. are burnable trash.
- •All clothes collected will be donated and reused. Please do not remove any buttons etc.

Put non-wearable clothes in burnable trash.
